1. Slieve Gullion Forest		This site visit will be led by the Ring of Gullion AONB Officer and Park staff from Newry Mourne and Down District Council. It will showcase the work done to transform Slieve Gullion forest from an area of dereliction to a vibrant hub attracting over269,000 vehicles through the gate since it opened in 2014. This has led to a range of challenges including traffic management that will be highlighted on the visit.		
2. Derrymore House Estate		This site visit will go to the fantastic grounds of Derrymore House which is a National Trust property. The site is adjacent to the communities of Bessbrook and Camlough but is underutilised. This site visit will look at the plans to revitalise the site with new trails and activities linked to the community.		
3. Slieve Gullion mountain path		This site visit will take you up on to the summit of Slieve Gullion and will therefore be more physically demanding. It will provide an opportunity to see the work that is being done to open up this great area but also to manage the trails and erosion in ways that are sensitive to the landscape and the habitats.		
4. Camlough lake		Camlough lake is used extensively for watersports especially open water swimming and canoeing. The lake gained fame in 2009 when over 200 swimmers entered the Guinness World Records with the longest open water relay swim of 684.75km. This site visit will let you explore the lake (from the water) and see the proposed developments and management issues.
